**Hope Pierce Tartt Scholarship Fund
Guidelines Summary
As amended on September 23, 2011**

Mrs. Hope Pierce Tartt, a native of Marshall, Texas, bequeathed the greater part of her estate to be used for scholarships. This bequest made possible the establishment of the Hope Pierce Tartt Scholarship Fund. All funds are distributed through tax exempt participating schools.

The guidelines for college and university scholarship consideration include the following:

- 1. Amount**
Suggested scholarship amounts can range from \$1,000 to \$2,500 per semester. The maximum is \$5,000 per academic year (usually 2 semesters).
- 2. Residence**
Scholarship awards shall be given only to students who are United States citizens and have resided in Harrison, Gregg, Marion, Panola, or Upshur Counties in Texas for 24 months. All eligible Harrison County residents will be funded before allocations are made to eligible students from other counties. Residence is determined as of September 1 of the school year.
- 3. Academic Eligibility**
(a) Recipients shall be enrolled as a full-time student, (b) first year recipients shall be those having “C” grade average or better on high school courses, meeting other enrollment requirements and (c) maintain a 2.0 grade point average or better during the first freshman semester, and thereafter during each semester of continued eligibility.
- 4. Financial Eligibility Includes**
Student must demonstrate financial need for a Tartt grant as determined on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) filed with the College Scholarship Service (CSS), or US Department of Education, www.fafsa.ed.gov. The student and/or Parents’ IRS 1040 and full disclosure of all resources is required. The student is eligible when the combined adjusted gross income for all family members supporting one or more college students does not exceed \$160,000. “Family Income” as used herein shall mean disclosure of all resources available to support the student.
- 5. Additional Eligibility Includes**
Each school may have requirements in addition to those stated in the detailed guidelines. Students must not be a close relative of a member of the Board of Trustees; an officer or employee of Hope Pierce Tartt Scholarship Fund. Prior approval is required for any deviation from the guidelines.

If you believe you may be eligible for Hope Pierce Tartt Scholarship consideration, submit your application through the Financial Aid Office of the school or your choice. Eligible schools are those not tax supported in Texas, or Centenary College, Shreveport, Louisiana. A list of participating schools is available upon request from P.O. Box 1964, Marshall, Texas 75671.
