

2020-2021 Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women's Scholarship Deadline: August 1

Given that Indigenous Women of the United States and Canada suffer from disproportionately and overwhelmingly high rates of violence, the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women's Scholarship seeks to honor missing and murdered Indigenous Women, raise awareness about this issue, educate future leaders who will address this and other Native American issues, and provide financial support to students at Texas Christian University who demonstrate commitment to these issues.

- 1. All recipients must meet the University's minimum criteria for receiving financial aid.
- 2. All applicants must submit a statement not to exceed one page that explains and demonstrates her/his connection and/or commitment to tribal communities and cultures, relation to a missing and murdered Indigenous woman (if applicable), and how she/he will seek to honor and raise awareness regarding missing and murdered Indigenous Women through coursework, co-curricular activities, community engagement, or other means.
- 3. Application (see below) and one-page statement must be submitted through your TCU Financial Aid Portal in PDF format by August 1.
- 4. Previous recipients can re-apply, but must do so annually.
